Lessons were delivered in a well disciplined and controlled way. Staff were able to observe pupils and improve their own subject knowledge.
Dance Coaching  CUITC David Smith  Spring 5 weeks 2 ½ hours  Nursery and Reception Pupils	£375	All pupils engaged in fun dance sessions. Staff noted how some pupils who can often be disengaged were joining in happily. Ideas given for staff to continue with their own dance sessions next term.
Multi skills session for KS1 pupils at RRCA  Class 6 to attend  Mon 21 March	£55	Class 6 pupils all had the opportunity to take part in an inter schools sports activity. Continued positive links with secondary school.
Action Ants  Fun Active session for Reception  Summer 1 6 weeks x 2hrs 3 classes	£600	Pupils experienced new activities, never tried out before including archery and fencing. Pupils all gained success and enjoyment. Staff extremely positive and could work alongside groups, focusing on individual pupils when they were required.
