Following complaints from parents regarding the dog fouling around the local area, we contacted the council. They have posted warning stickers around the area, cleaned up the mess and have been out on patrol today.

Cumberland Council have teams who patrol the streets and parks, educate people about responsible dog ownership and, if required, enforce the law. It is a criminal offence not to clean up after your dog and you can be fined up to £1,000.

The Law says that the person responsible for the dog has a duty to clean up after their dog even if they were not with it or did not see it foul..
